Adorable **BEE** is very sweet, but she's also very shy with people. She was brought to AAS from the community, and during her spay surgery, the DVM found mucosa of bladder to be protruding cranially, so the tissue was resected. She moved into foster care to recover and to be monitored. The results of several ultrasounds indicate that her bladder has healed completely. Her urinary habits are normal at this time. In her foster home, **BEE** tended to hide, but could be petted at times. She is not aggressive; she's just learning to appreciate all the things that people are good for. **BEE** needs a patient adopter, and will do best in a quiet home with a cat friend.
